

Look Back, Look Ahead

Mills Lecture will explore 50 years of EM history and what the next 50 may bring

ACEP BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEMBER KEVIN KLAUER, DO, EJD, FACEP, sees this year's James D. Mills Jr. Memorial Lecture as a talk among friends.

The panel discussion, at 1:30 p.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 2, is titled, simply, "ACEP@50: Past, Present, and Future." After a chat about the history of the specialty, Dr. Klauer, who is *ACEP Now* Medical Editor in Chief, will lead panelists through an examination of the current state and explore the future.

"If there's been this much change in 50 years, what does the next 50 look like?" he says. "I think that will be a fascinat-

RORRIE LECTURE

Battle Burnout with Advocacy

Rorrie lecturer recommends fighting frustration with a plan to make a difference

EMERGENCY PHYSICIANS who are feeling burned out may not think adding advocacy to their plate is the solution. But they should consider it, says emergency physician Hon. Nathaniel Schlicher, MD, JD, MBA, FACEP, who will deliver this year's Colin C. Rorrie, Jr. Lecture, "Finding Wellness and Purpose Through Advocacy," on Wednesday, Oct. 3 at 1:30 p.m.

"Wellness is not as simple as yoga and exercise and deep breathing, but it is finding purpose and advocacy and doing work to change the world in which you're frustrated," says Dr. Schlicher, a former state senator from Washington state. "It's

ing conversation to have, as the options for emergency medicine and the opportunities in emergency medicine are nearly limitless in the future."

Dr. Klauer will moderate the panel, comprised of Pamela Bensen, MD, MS, FACEP; Kerry Broderick, MD, FACEP; Gregory Henry, MD, FACEP; and Ryan Stanton, MD, FACEP.

The conversation will note that some 68 percent of hospital admissions nationally come through emergency departments and that despite the efforts of payers and lawmakers to dissuade ED use, approximately 20 percent of the population visit the ED at least once annually and 7 percent make two or more visits.

"We are positioned to make sure that we can impact admission decisions and utilization decisions regarding diagnostic imaging, as well as

laboratory diagnostics," Dr. Klauer says. "And really reduce avoidable admissions. Emergency medicine must serve a critical role as the first point of contact for most patients who are admitted to the hospital."

Other important topics to discuss include payment reform tied to health insurers retrospective denial of coverage, which affects access to care and how physicians are reimbursed; the scope of EM in the next 50 years; and physician resiliency and burnout.

Dr. Klauer says ACEP has been working on both legislative and regulatory fronts to ensure that the college has a national say on issues affecting emergency physicians. And

> while those efforts continue, it's important to remember, he says, that progress doesn't need to be fast, and it doesn't have to be easy.

> "It just has to be meaningful and impactful," Dr. Klauer says. "We will fight as hard and as long as we have to for our specialty and, most importantly, for our patients. Some of those wins come easily, such as the progress made on the opioid crisis, because the whole nation understands the impor-

tance of the issue. But other initiatives and other issues may not be as obvious or as well known, requiring time, education, and persistence." •

something that we can do and we do and we should do as providers and [emergency physicians]. We are some of the best advocates because we see the problems in the world. I've always said we sit at the intersection of all failed public policy!"

Dr. Schlicher doesn't want people to think that the only forms of advocacy are testifying before a government panel or running for office. It can start with just writing down a set of short-term, medium-term, or long-term goals.

Or "it can be as simple as serving on your hospital's committee," he says. "Working on improving throughput and flow. Meeting with your leadership to tackle the problem of quality. Working on your nursing staffing ratio if you're having struggles there. You don't have to climb to the mountain. You can walk the hill first "

Dr. Schlicher warns that not everybody needs to be an advocate; some physicians are content with shift work and helping patients.

To those physicians, he notes that they're already doing "critically important" advocacy work.

"Advocacy is what we do every day as [emergency physicians]," he says. "Whether it's calling when someone needs to be admitted and advocating with your hospitalist for an admission. Whether it's working with your

techs and nurses to get a study done when it's late at night or off hours."

But for those who feel themselves burning out, he urges a new level of advocacy as an option to remember what made them passionate about the specialty in the first place.

"We're all highly competitive people," Dr. Schlicher says. "There's always the next thing. You got into undergrad, and then you had to get into medical school. You got into medical school, and you had to get into residency. You got into residency to get the best job. All of a sudden, we've reached the job, and now it's like, 'What's next?'... Sometimes we forget that we can engage in something new and advocate for something challenging to find our purpose and wellness once more."

"What I've found about the great cultures—and health care, especially [ACEP] members, the people on the front line all the time—is that we have to thank each other," Mr. Spence says. "There is a 'thank you' gap in health care."

Mr. Spence, co-founder and former CEO of GSD&M, the biggest advertising agency in Austin, will give ACEP18's keynote address Tuesday, Oct. 2 at 5:30 p.m. His talk, "The Pow-

er of Purpose in Business and Life," is a distillation of his 40-plus years in marketing, a career that saw his agency create advertising, like the iconic baby-back ribs jingle for Chili's restaurants and the famed "Don't Mess with Texas" anti-littering campaign for the Lone Star State.

For most people, Mr. Spence's message is to find their purpose; but for emergency physicians who often get into the specialty to help people at their worst moments, it may be more about keeping that purpose.

"Aristotle may have said it the best. 'Where your talents and the needs of the world cross, there lies your vocation," Mr. Spence quotes. "The men and women [of ACEP], the students, faculty, they're using their talent to truly meet the needs of the world.

Every day.

Of course, he understands burnout, and his advice to combat it is surprisingly simple: Take a walk.

"Here's what I've found about burnout: we're all so destination driven," he says. "Got to get to work. Got to get the kids to school. Got to go get this...I've found that walking is the greatest medicine for burnout. You have no destination. It's a journey. Walking

means you can actually put your phone down and look up."

And once the walk is done, emergency physicians can return to the grind of their day job with more appreciation of the purpose that brought them to the specialty in the first place.

"In the health care industry, we've got to help

each other," Mr. Spence says. "We already know the government is not going to help us. And the bankers aren't going to help us. We've got to take care of one another.

"Everyone is fighting some kind of battle, including our caregivers. So we we've got to make sure that we help each other live well."
